As part of our ongoing commitment to keeping children safe, we would like to take this opportunity to highlight the importance of online safety, particularly around social media use and mobile phones.

Many popular social media platforms have minimum age restrictions, typically 13 years and over. These limits are in place to help protect children from content and interactions that may not be appropriate for their age or stage of development. Even when children appear confident with technology, younger pupils often need guidance and boundaries to help keep them safe online.

We strongly encourage parents and carers to:

- Be aware of the age restrictions on social media apps and games
- Regularly check your child's mobile phone, tablet or other devices
- Talk openly with your child about what they do online and who they communicate with
- Set clear rules about app downloads, screen time and privacy settings
